

I've always believed that money is a measure of survival, not of purpose. In my mind, the scope of this festival has a broader reach as there is no better platform offered throughout the year for the Naper Settlement to share its purpose with the community than Naper Days. In the process of fund raising, we must never overlook the significant importance of friend raising and bringing the community and families together.

League of Women Voters of Naperville Announces Rosemary Martin Democracy in Action Award Winner

The Naperville League to host award ceremony.

Naperville, IL: The League of Women Voters of Naperville announces the 2010 recipient of the Rosemary Martin Democracy in Action Award: The DuPage Chapter of the Illinois Ballot Integrity Project. The Democracy in Action Award was created in 2006 to honor former Naperville League president and long-time Naperville resident Rosemary Martin, whose dedication to the informed participation of citizens in their government mirrored the mission of the League of Women Voters at the local, state, and national levels. The Award recognizes the work of individuals, organizations, or public bodies in advancing this essential goal of democracy. A plaque listing each year's honoree hangs in the Naperville Municipal Center.

Nominations received this year were reviewed by the 2010 Committee. The Illinois Ballot Integrity Project (IBIP) was chosen for its work at local, county, and state levels to ensure the reliability of voting systems and the authenticity of the voting process, a basic principle of democracy and the primary civic action of citizens. Co-Chairs Jean Kaczmarek and Melisa Urda are recognized for their courage and tenacity in calling attention to potential problems and encouraging government leaders to address this fundamental issue in a meaningful way. The Award will be presented to IBIP Co-Chairs Kaczmarek and Urda at a dinner on Wednesday, June 2, at BlackFinn American Saloon in downtown Naperville, following the League's Annual Meeting. The public is invited to join us in honoring Ms. Kaczmarek and Ms. Urda. Details of the dinner and reservation information can be found at our website: www.naperville.il.lwv.org.
